Carleton Summer Academic Programs

Mirroring the **academic** commitment of the College, Carleton Summer Academic Programs offer high school students the opportunity to live and learn on a liberal arts college campus for three weeks, working one-on-one with current **Carleton faculty**. Each one of the six programs offered carries the possibility of earning **six Carleton term credits**, which can be transferred to other institutions (at the discretion of their Registrar).

Language & Global Issues Institute

An excellent introduction to college-level work in language, humanities and social sciences, where collaborative research is encouraged. In addition to the intensive study and use of a **foreign language**, students will become familiar with advanced approaches to disciplines with which they have little or no prior experience.

Summer Writing Program

Emphasizes a writing process approach, teaching participants how to compose **academic papers** similar to those that are expected in college. The program is designed for college-bound students with strong reading and writing abilities.

Summer Science Institute

Allows students to learn, think and write like a scientist by working with Carleton faculty and undergraduate research assistants. Students will complete a **collaborative guided research project** which will culminate in a presentation at the end of the program.

Summer Quantitative Reasoning Institute

Provides students with a realistic glimpse of what Carleton students experience when they develop their quantitative reasoning skills as a **social science** major in pursuit of careers in such diverse fields as law, science, academics, public policy and public administration, journalism, and information technology.

Summer Computer Science Institute

Computer Science is about more than computers: it is the systematic study of processes for solving problems. Students focus on **understanding** how to think about these **processes**, how to program computers to implement them, and how to apply computer science ideas to real problems of interest.

Summer Humanities Institute

Through study of advanced topics in history, English literature, and the history of visuality, students explore **essential questions** of what it means to be a human being living in society and how people use words, images, and performance to challenge, affirm, or transform themselves.
