In consultation with University of St. Thomas leadership, the full-time faculty in the Graduate School of Professional Psychology (GSPP) is willing to offer the following for an Argosy student, who is **CURRENTLY IN GOOD STANDING** in the MA or PsyD program at Argosy University and interested in enrolling in the:

MA Program in Counseling Psychology in the GSPP

- For Argosy students who are currently completing their MA practicum as part of their degree program, the GSPP faculty will unfortunately <u>not</u> be able to assist them in enrolling in a comparable practicum course at the University of St. Thomas.
- 2) For ALL Argosy students who are interested in being considered as an applicant to the MA Program in the GSPP, <u>the following application requirements must be</u> <u>completed by April 1, 2019</u>. More information about the MA Program and "How to Apply" can be found at <u>this link</u>:
 - i. Completed MA Application
 - ii. Submission of:
 - a. Official transcript from Argosy University
 - b. **Official** scores from the General Test (NOT Psychology Subject Test) of the Graduate Record Examination (GRE)
 - c. 2 letters of recommendation
 - d. Writing Sample
 - e. Resume

If the GSPP faculty considers an Argosy student's application materials and would like to meet face-to-face with the Argosy student, the GSPP will reach out to the Argosy student to set up an on-campus interview with a FT faculty member in the GSPP to be held sometime in late April.

Also, if an Argosy student would be offered admission into the MA program, <u>the GSPP</u> <u>faculty would evaluate each student's previous coursework</u>, which they completed at Argosy University, to see which credits might be able to transfer into the GSPP's MA program.

- 3) If an Argosy student is accepted into the MA program in the GSPP and has <u>already</u> <u>secured</u> a practicum placement to start their MA Practicum in fall, 2019, they are required to (regardless of whether or not they have already successfully completed equivalent courses):
 - i. Enroll in and successfully complete the following courses during:
 - a. summer semester, 2019:
 - 1. CPSY 606: Basic Counseling Skills Lab
 - 2. CPSY 680: Diversity Issues in Counseling
 - b. Fall semester, 2019 (Concurrent with the 1st practicum course in the GSPP):
 - 3. CPSY 607: Ethics and Professional Issues

PsyD Program in the GSPP

 All students who apply to the doctoral program in the GSPP must already have earned a master's degree. Argosy students without a master's degree should complete a master's degree, either within the GSPP or elsewhere, prior to applying to the doctoral program.

2) <u>No Argosy student will be able to matriculate directly into the doctoral program in the GSPP for Fall 2019.</u>

If an Argosy student would like to be considered for the doctoral program in the GSPP, they must apply via the usual admissions process and submit all their materials by the deadline of December 15, 2019. More information about the PsyD Program and "How to Apply" can be found at <u>this link</u>.

If an Argosy student would be offered admission into the PsyD program in the GSPP for a program start in fall, 2020, the GSPP faculty would evaluate each student's previous coursework, which they completed at Argosy University, to see which credits might be able to transfer into the GSPP's PsyD program.
