# **Q** Review your college options early

With over 50 Minnesota colleges and universities participating, you can begin familiarizing yourself with potential options. Visit <u>www.myhighered.mn.gov/colleges</u> to use the College Search Tool, where you can view campus profiles of schools you are most interested in. Find the estimated cost of attending each college, as well as its average price after financial aid has been awarded. You can also check out each school's graduate employment outcomes and median annual salaries based on field of study. Create a MyHigherEd account to keep track of your top choices!

## • Financial aid makes college affordable

It is important to understand the costs of attending college, as they can vary greatly based on institution type. The good news is the majority of students receive financial aid to help pay for school!

In Minnesota, there are significant financial aid programs for students, including the Minnesota State Grant and North Star Promise. Depending on your family's income, you may be able to receive financial aid that will fully cover the costs of your tuition and fees!

To access financial aid, you must complete the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) during your senior year. For students with undocumented status, the Minnesota Dream Act application will provide you access to state and institutional financial aid.

Submitting the FAFSA OR MN DREAM ACT is the most important step to accessing financial aid

### What is Direct Admissions?

Direct Admissions is a State of Minnesota program that makes sure you know you have multiple college options after high school. At the beginning of your senior year, you will receive a personalized communication that lists the Minnesota colleges and universities that are offering you proactive admission.

You will be able to apply to the colleges of your choice for free (and with confidence since you are already admitted). You already know the "will I get in?" question has already been answered with a "YES!"



The colleges and universities on your personalized list are determined by your unweighted Grade Point Average (GPA) to the end of your junior year, as well as your grades in the core areas of math, science and English from your 10th and 11th grade years.

As a student, you will be placed into an academic tier based on your GPA. Colleges have opted into one of these academic tiers based on their own admissions criteria.

Your GPA will place you into an ACADEMIC TIER. which determines the colleges you are admitted to Direct Admissions can help to simplify your college admissions process, as your list will show you all the Minnesota colleges and universities that are offering you proactive admission.

Remember - You are not limited to the colleges on your list! Direct Admissions can serve as a great starting point to begin to review your many college options.
