All awards are based on funds availability. Eligible students with complete applications on file by the dates above will be considered for awards in the specified term. After all available funds have been awarded, completed applications will be placed on a waiting list. Applications will still be accepted after these dates but students are much less likely to be awarded.

Complete Application Checklist

In order for your application to be considered **complete**, your application must include the following:

- ☐ Student Section including all the required information that is signed and dated
- ☐ Completed Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) or Minnesota Dream Act application
- □ **College or University Section** completed by an authorized representative at the college or university you attend that includes all of the required information

Program Information

The **Minnesota Underrepresented Student Teacher Grant** provides postsecondary financial assistance to eligible students who belong to a racial or ethnic group underrepresented in the Minnesota teacher workforce.

The **Minnesota Student Teachers in Shortage Areas Grant** provides postsecondary financial assistance to eligible students who intend to teach in a license shortage area or rural school district in Minnesota after graduating and receiving their teaching license.

Eligibility

To be eligible, teacher candidates must, at a minimum:

- Be enrolled in an eligible Minnesota college or university in an eligible teacher preparation program that requires at least 12 weeks of student teaching;
- Be meeting satisfactory academic progress;
- · Demonstrate financial need; and
- Meet one or more of the following requirements:
 - 1. Intend to teach in a designated Rural School District in Minnesota.
 - 2. Intend to teach in an identified license shortage area.
 - 3. Belong to a racial or ethnic group underrepresented in the Minnesota teacher workforce.

Social Security Number
